## to have something done - CLARIFICATION

A This is used when you want something done but can't or don't want to do it yourself, so you PAY someone else to do it.

## The best examples are:

- I have my hair done by the salon "David" in the Shopping Centre.
- I have my car serviced once every three months.
- We have our accounts done by an accountant.

## It's a combination of:

- 1) to have or to get
- 2) an object
- 3) a past participle
- B Of course, you can use the structure in MANY tenses and with various expressions. Here is a list of examples.

PRESENT	Your house is a bit cold!  Yes, we're having central heating installed next month.
	Where do you get your hair cut?  I have it done at the salon near the station.
FUTURE	Your hair is a bit long!  Yes, I'm going to have it cut soon.
PAST	Your car is running well.  Yes. I've just had it serviced.
	Where's your old dog?  We had him put down.
SUGGESTIONS	My tooth is hurting.  I'd get it looked at if I were you.
	My passport expires next month.  You'd better have it renewed.
	My trousers are too long.  Why don't you get them taken up?
